It is important to support schools and colleges to ensure our young people get the best start. That includes investing in apprenticeships to help them secure work.



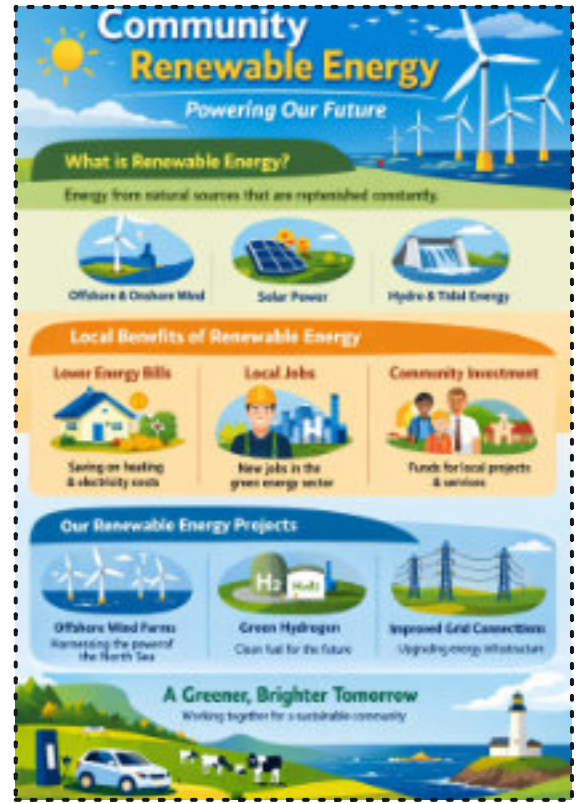
